#### 1. SPECIAL SCHOOL FOR THE MENTALLY RETARDED:-

Sneha Society for Rural Reconstruction has started Special School for the Mentally Retarded in the year 1995. Before initiation of the special school the organization has conducted survey in the Nizamabad District and noticed there are more children and adults with mental retardation. The rural India has 6% of disabled people where the prevalence of Orthopedically Handicapped, Visually Handicapped and Hearing-impairedness is lowering down and there is visible growth of mental retardation, Autism, ADHD, Down's Syndrome and Cerebral Palsy children in India.

Mental retardation (MR) refers to substantial limitations in present functioning. It starts before age 18 and is characterized by significantly sub-average intellectual functioning, existing concurrently with related limitations in two or more of the following applicable adaptive skill areas: Communication, self-care, home living, social skills, community use, self-direction, health and safety, functional academics, leisure and work.

There are various known causes of Mental Retardation, including genetic disorders, maternal infections, psychosocial conditions, drug exposure, and environmental chemical exposure. The established risk factors for Mental Retardation include: Various genetic disorders (e.g. Down's Syndrome, phenylketonuria), Certain maternal infections during pregnancy (e.g. rubella), Mother who abuses substances such as alcohol during pregnancy, Certain psychosocial conditions (e.g. problems with care giving, low socioeconomic status, low parental education), Maternal exposure to various drugs (e.g. thalidomide, valproic acid), Maternal exposure to environmental chemicals

The National Institute For the Mentally Handicapped is Providing Technical Guidance and Training Man Power Sponsored by our organization Continuously. The organization is providing Special Education to the Mentally Retarded children in the age group of 5 to 18 years. The classification of children is done according to the chronological age, mental age and their functional abilities.

The SNESOR is having classes Pre-Primary to Pre-Vocational All the Students are Divided in to 17 Different Classes. Total 185 children with Mental Retardation are being given Special education in our Special School for the Mentally Retarded. The Teacher and Student Ratio is 1:10.

Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment, Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities, Government of India, New Delhi is providing Grant-in-Aid to run the Special School for the Mentally Retarded at Nizamabad of Telangana State, India.

	TOTAL	199	185	14	During the academic year 2020-2021, 48 students (26%) have been promoted to next classes who have scored 80% and above, 27 are perusing in the same class and following additional normal class syllabus as they are not having appropriate age to be promoted to the next class, 4 students are given laptop training who can operate it independently. We have dropped 13 students as per the age norms and 01 due to various other reasons. Few children trained in craft work, Female students are given training in kitchen management and Some of the children shown good development in Yoga and Dance

During the year 2020-2021 the Day Scholars were not present regularly due to the COVID 19 pandemic The progress of the Hostellers and Day students is fair. 48 Mentally children achieved above 80% and promoted to next grade. 137 Mentally Retarded children are continuing in the same class due to non completion of 3 years and not achieved 80% and the pandemic. 14 Students are Dropped out From School, Out of 14 Drop outs 13 are as per the age norms of the Ministry and remaining 01 dropped out due to Severe Disability and provided permanent Rehabilitation. During the current year We have received 18 applications for the admission into Special School for Mentally Retarded 14 Students are given admission during the Academic year 2021-2022. Total 14 Students are given New admission.

<u>Staff Position</u>: Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment has sanctioned 39 posts for Special School for Mentally Retarded. All are on the Board the Posts are Principal- 1, Trained Teachers/Special Educators- 4,Trained Graduate Teachers 5, Assistant Trained Teachers 6, Part Time Therapists and Specialist 8,Cook Cum Helper 1,Accountant cum Warden 1, Sweeper Cum Watchman 1 and Ayah/Caregivers 12. All the staff are eligible as per the Ministry norms. We are thankful to the Ministry for the sanctioning of the posts for which We are able to provide qualitative services for the beneficiaries.

- a) <u>Individual Educational Plan</u>: IEP is an Individualized Educational Plan prepared to meet the unique needs of the children and as such IEPs is prepared for every Mentally Retarded student in the school for Teaching and Learning Plan. This contains long term and short term goals. Generally for every New admission in the school based on the normal age and his current functioning level Assessment is carried out based on the suitable Functional Assessment Checklist for Programming developed by NIPIED. The Assessment is carried out by seeking information through parents, Observation and presenting the task to the student. After the assessment the goals are taken for the students and thereby suitable teaching and learning materials are prepared for the individual students. The students are trained and then at the end of three months evaluation is done as to how much the student has achieved after the training. The teacher also uses the Task analysis for the children.
- b) <u>Preparation of Teaching and Learning Material (Educational Aids):</u> All the students require different types of teaching aids such as stencils for tracing, real objects for counting, color concept, size concept, developing of measurement concept and other reasoning concepts. Matching and identification of alphabets, names etc. The materials are generally durable, accessible and of low cost. Mostly educable material related to reading and writing are prepared keeping the texture, its attractiveness and motivating the attention of the children towards education.
- c) Residential care for Mentally retarded children: As the Special School for the Mentally Retarded is situated in the District Headquarters i.e. Nizamabad town, only the residents of Nizamabad town are availing Special Education services. But there are many Mentally Retarded children residing in the different villages of the Nizamabad District and also from neighboring Districts who cannot avail the Special Education services. To give services to these children SNESOR is offering residential care for these needy children. This year 70 children in the chronological age group of 5 to 18 years are given residential services. Most of them have shown good improvement. These children are given Food, Medical Care, Recreational and other facilities in the Residential Care. The children belonging to Nizamabad, Adilabad, Nirmal, Kamareddy, and Jagityal Districts are provided hostel facility.
- d) <u>Physiotherapy Services</u>: Two Physiotherapists visits the Special School for Mentally Retarded twice a week. During their visits they Diagnose the cases and provides the therapy for the needy children specially Multiple Disabled and Cerebral Palsy. They also provides the training to the parents for continuing of the physiotherapy at home. They also prepare the low cost assistive devices for the needy children. The therapists deals with all types of children having physical deformities. They give exercises for standing and walking They also give exercises for the improvement of grasps. They also advice the parents for lifting positioning and carrying of their children who are having physical deformities. The spasticity in the children are reduced, their limbs are relieved by Stretching exercises. The children are independent in completion of their Self Help skills and through the exercises the drooling problems is also minimized. Physiotherapy is also provided to the cases who have undergone the Surgeries. 22 children receiving physiotherapy services.
- e) Behavior Modification and Treatment for Neuropsychiatric Disorders by Psychiatrist: The Psychiatrist visits twice in a week and Assessment is done for the children and identifies their behavioural and health problems and necessary therapy services such as behavior modification, medication, orientation for the parents. Diet for their children. How to give first aid for fits cases. Mostly fits children, Inattention, Hyperactivity and Impulsivity in ADHD children are benefitted. Treating ADHD usually requires medication. Parents are tainted in Identifying the Autism children and how to develop reading and writing in them. The Psychiatrist also gives treatment for Anxiety and

Temper Tantrum type of Behaviours. He trains the staff in handling the children with Behavioral problems.

- f) Medical Care: The Medical doctor visits the Special School for the Mentally Retarded once a week and does general health check up for the children and needy cases are referred to the Government General Hospital for services. The parents are also counseled for the maintenance of good health of their children and Personal Hygiene. The staff and the parents are also educated about the first aid to be provided for the fits cases. The Medical Doctor has conducts training program for the Parents on regular intervals for Management of their children during menstruation and taking care of maintaining personal hygiene. Children suffering from Fever, Cold & Cough, General Ailments and Skin Problems are provided treatment. Neurologists Services are also availed for Fits cases.
- g) Speech Therapy Services: The Speech Therapist visits the Sneha Society's Special School for Mentally Retarded twice a week. During his visits he does the speech and language assessment and prepares I.E.P for Speech and language development. The Speech Therapist starts with the babbling sounds, bilabials by using different educational materials for speech. If these are achieved than they proceed to word levels like body parts, fruits. Developing attention is the basic necessity which is developed by stacking of beads. The cases having drooling problems are given massage for reduction of drooling problems. The Speech therapist also gives different types of mouth exercises through play therapy. The children through speech therapy can speak few small words and children who are having Autistic characteristics are also responding and trying to speak and reply to the teachers. The ADHD students are also maintaining eye contact while reading and writing. The children have developed and the parents are satisfied with the speech therapy..
- h) <u>Training in Yoga Asanas</u>: The Yoga teacher visits the Special School for Mentally Retarded Four days in a week. Sneha Society for Rural Reconstruction is providing Yoga Services for Mentally Retarded students. They can Perform different types of Yoga Asanas independently. Through yoga the concentration of children has increased most of the children having hyperactivity are benefited from yoga. Some of the children suffering from sleeplessness have got relief through yoga. The children have also learned new Yoga Asana. Through the different Pranayams the children have become active and look fresh. Inhaling and Exhaling Exercises and also fitness exercises are taught to the children. The parents are also trained for imparting Yoga to the children in their homes. 55 children are taught thoroughly to perform Yoga independently. 12 students performed Yoga on International Day for the Persons with Disabilities on 3<sup>rd</sup> December 2020.
- i) Training in Music & Drama: The Music teacher visits the Special School for Mentally Retarded four days in a week. She imparts training to the children in singing dancing and different cultural activities. It has also increased the speech and language of the children. The children are able to perform cultural activities independently. The organization is providing Dance & Music through which the children have developed good talents in dancing and they can perform group dances and individual dances too. The children have performed very well during the Teacher's Day, Pandit Deendayal Upadhyay's Birth Anniversary, Children's Day, International Day for the Disabled, Supposed Christmas, on the occasion of New Year, Louie Braille Birthday and International Day for Women.
- j) <u>Training in Craft Work</u>: The craft teacher visits the Special School for the Mentally Retarded four days in a week. She imparts training to the students in making different craft items. This increases the eye hand coordination, developing new skills, confidence building, Develop the Creativity among the Students and overall a thinking that they can do something. The products taught to them are making handbags with beads, bangles with thread, ear rings, necklaces, door hangings, decorative hair rubber bands, key chains, cloth purses, greeting card making, door mats. Mostly Pre-Vocational students are given training in craft work. Due to craft training Vocational skills are developed among the Mentally Retarded students. 36 students are given craft training.
- k) <u>Laptop Training</u>: Smt. Nancy Manjula, Our Special Educator gives training in Laptop operation to 4 Mentally Retarded children who are studying in Secondary and Pre-Vocational I classes. The children are taught how to operate the Laptop. The teacher also teaches how to open the different files in the Laptop. The children learn good habits, story telling, seasons, how to respect the elders and many more things which is also helpful for socialization of the students. The children are independent in operation of Laptops.
- l) <u>Free Transportation for the Day Scholars</u>.: Sneha Society for Rural Reconstruction is providing free transportation for 115 Mentally Retarded children for which we have hired school bus and auto rickshaws. We pick up the Mentally Retarded children from their Home to School and drop them back to their Homes. Ayahs and teachers escort the children while transportation. The parents are happy for the arrangement of the conveyance for their children. 115 children are benefitted from this.

- m) <u>Distribution of Stipends for the Day Scholars</u>: Sneha Society for Rural Reconstruction is providing Stipends for the Day Scholars to 115 Mentally Retarded children Most of these children are very poor. The stipends are not given to the parents due to non-presence of students during the COVID 19 pandemic.
- n) Regular Parental Meetings and Counseling: Sneha Society for Rural Reconstruction is conducting a Regular parents Meeting quarterly at Special School for Mentally Retarded. During the meetings we discuss on the various issues like development of the child in the curriculum and speech. Training the parents in the Management of their children, Training the parents for imparting Yoga to their children. SNESOR is organizing the Parental Counseling Sessions. Through counseling session SNESOR would make understand the parents that this is situation of the child where she/he needs special support and also infuse confidence among parent that the situation of the child would be changed. The Counseling is given to the parents by the Psychiatrist so that the parents accept their child besides his/her disability. The psychiatric guidance is availed during the parental meeting.
- o) Distribution of Essential Commodities and Corona Prevention Homeopathy Medicines: Sneha Society for Rural Reconstruction is a voluntary social organization working in the Nizamabad District for the empowerment of differently abled by rendering various services for them. In view of COVID 19 We have distributed essential provisions for 146 families such as Rice, pulses, cooking oil, chili powder, salt and masks. During the Lock down We have identified poor and needy families of disabled children who required necessary help. We have distributed essential provisions and Corona Prevention Homeopathy Medicines for 200 families of Disabled children with the help of Dr, Mahipal President Sneha Society, by involving Shri. D. Vittal Rao, Chairman Zilla Praja Parishad, Smt. Nitu Kiran, Mayor, Municipal Corporation, Nizamabad, Smt. Jhansi Laxmi, Project Director, Department of Women Children, Disabled & Senior Citizens, Shri.S. Siddaiah Secretary and Smt.S. Jyothi, Principal, Special School for the Mentally Retarded.
- p) <u>Uploading of UDID Cards</u>: As per the instructions of Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment, Department of Empowerment of Persons With Disabilities, Government of India, vide Letter No. F.No.R-22033/3/2018-DD-II/V dated April 2020. The organization has uploaded 185 applications of our beneficiaries for the UDID Cards by 31-05-2020. We have uploaded applications of 100% of beneficiaries who are studying at our Special School for the Mentally Retarded.
- q) <u>Organizing other Relevant Programs at Special School for the Mentally Retarded</u>: On par with Running Special School for the Mentally Retarded Sneha Society for Rural Reconstruction is also organized various programs related to Special School for Mentally Retarded.:
- 1. <u>Telangana Formation Day</u>: Telangana Formation Day was celebrated at Sneha Society for Rural Reconstruction on 2<sup>nd</sup> June 2020 on the occasion of formation of Telangana State. The celebration started with cutting the cake and 5 staff members were felicitated and presented mementoes for their contribution in their respective field Smt. N.Vimala Trained Graduate Teacher, Special School for MR, Smt.T.Varalaxmi Trained Graduate Teacher, Special School for Visually Handicapped, Smt. Sangeetha, Case Worker Sakhi/One Stop Center, Smt. Vishwaja Outreach Worker, TI Project and Smt. N Venkatalaxmi, Trained Graduate Teacher, Special School for MR. The children were distributed sweets. Sneha Society Secretary S.Siddaiah, Principal S.Jyothi, Vice Principal P.Rajeshwari, Mentally Retarded Children and Staff participated in the program.
- 2. He also presented the Expenditure Incurred for the previous year and proposed budget for the forth coming year. Governing Body members planted the trees in the premises of DRC. The President distributed Homeopathy Medicines for the prevention of Corona. All the members of Sneha Society shared their experiences and spoke on the occasion. Mr. T.Gangadhar, Treasurer, Mr. Sherla Dayananad, Joint Secretary, Mr. Sham Sunder Ladda, M.V Someshwarlu, Thati Veeresham and Sudhakar Executive Members participated in the Meeting. Our Mentally Retarded Children acted as Teachers and managed their classes in respect of their teachers. Shri Vital Rao, Chairman, Zilla Praja Parishad, Nizamabad participated as Chief Guest and paid their homeage by garlanding the photo of Sarvepalli Radha Krishnanji. The Chief Guest felicitated Smt. Alivelu, Teacher, Special School for the Mentally Retarded, Smt.Rojakala, Teacher Special School for the Visually Handicapped on this occasion for their services. #### 2. <u>SPECIAL SCHOOL FOR THE VISUALLY HANDICAPPED</u>:-

Sneha Society for Rural Reconstruction has initiated special school for Visually Handicapped in the year 1999 at present there were 90 Visually Handicapped children who are receiving Special Education Services. The organization has improved the capacities of staff to work with visually Handicapped Children.

- a) Formal Education: As we understood very well, that Visually Handicapped children can also have the capacities of cognitive knowledge and can enhance education with special effort. All the Visually Handicapped children can educate in integrated set up or in Formal Schools. But as the teachers lack skills in most of village level schools, they have denied education. Hence, SNESOR initiated Special School for Visually Handicapped this school provides elementary education to the students and give the skills in Braille for 90 students.
- b) <u>Daily Living Skills</u>: The disabled should not be pampered or neglected because of their disabilities. They should be treated as any others normal person. This would boost their confidence and make them to be on their own. The Visually Handicapped child needs to be on his/her own to be on par with any other person.

The daily living skills would help them to be on their own. They are

- ◆ Activities in daily living
- Cognitive skills
- Tactile skills

- Language development
- Sound discrimination

- c) <u>Literacy in Braille Script</u>: SNESOR is equipped with staff who can teach in Braille script. The special educators give education in Braille Script. Braille books are supplied to the students who are studying from 1<sup>st</sup> class onwards but prior to it all the students are given education in Braille in Reading & Writing by following the normal school syllabus. Last Year NIVH, assisted us in getting the Braille Text Books and Audio CDs for the children.
- d). <u>District Resource Center for the Visually Challenged</u>: <u>District Administration developed</u> District Resource Center for the Visually Challenged and provided all the equipment with barrier free building where Computer Training, Laptop training, Braille Library Braille Typing on Braillers, Braille Printing are available for the Visually Challenged SNESOR acquired all the equipment for District Resource Center. All Our Visually Handicapped children studying in VIII to X Classes are provided training at District Resource Center.
- e). Orientation and Mobility for the Visually Handicapped Children: Orientation and Mobility training is given to the Visually Handicapped children regularly. Trained Mobility Instructor is appointed for their Orientation and Mobility. All the Visually Handicapped children are provided mobility canes for walking independently. Most of the children are independent in walking. Some of the multiple disabled are having the problem in mobility, Assistive devices are provided to them. Orientation and Mobility is very essential for the Visually Handicapped children.
- f. <u>Age appropriate Carrier Education</u>: The admissions are given to all the Visually Handicapped Children in the age appropriate class and Exploring carrier preferences, participating in job MELA's using Non Visual Methods
- g. Independent Living Skills: We provide training in sensory skills development and the use of adaptive skills and techniques to function independently in their daily life, including medication management, money identification/management, personal management and grooming, meal preparation, home care, fall prevention, safe movement/travel skills, the use of assistive technology, and sewing (making minor repairs by hand). This program also covers Travel/Movement Skills, Use of telephones and other communications devices use of writing guides for checks, letters and signature, Techniques for coping with vision loss and Information and referral to community resources
- h) Residential Care for the Visually Handicapped children: Sneha Society for Rural Reconstruction initiated Hostel for Visually Handicapped As the Special School for the Visually Handicapped is situated in the Headquarters i.e. Nizamabad Town through the Residential Care Services SNESOR is offering Residential Care for the needy children . This year 65 Visually Handicapped children in the age group of 5 to 18 years were given Residential Services . They are also being provided Special Education in Braille Script, training in activities of daily living and Orientation in Mobility. These children are provided food, Accommodation, Medical Care, Recreational and other facilities in the Residential Care. The children belonging to Nizamabad, Nirmal, Kamareddy and Adilabad Districts are provided hostel facility.
- i) Medical Care: The Medical Doctor visits the Special School for the Visually Handicapped once a week and does the General Health Check up for the children and needy cases are referred to the Government Hospital for treatment. We also provide free Medicines to the needy children. The Medical Doctor has conducted training program for the Visually Handicapped on maintaining Personal hygiene. Mostly scabies and general health problems are noticed at the hostel and provided the treatment.
- j) Training in Music and Singing: The Visually Handicapped children are given Special Training in Music by a trained professional who teaches sa re ga ma and music lessons regularly. Children who have developed these talents are taught vocal singing at our Special School for the Visually Handicapped. The School has developed a Musical team of children who can play the Keyboard, Dholak and other musical instruments. Their performance was highlighted by the Media on important occasions. Visually Handicapped children performed their cultural activities on the occasion of Children's Day, International Child Rights Day, International Day for the Disabled, Suppose Christmas, New Year Day, Louie Braille Birthday and International Women's Day Though the children are very active and interested in cultural program We are unable to provide them regular Music teacher. 30 children are provided training in Singing and Instrumental Playing.

- k) Regular Parents Meetings: Sneha Society for Rural Reconstruction is conducting a regular parents Meeting quarterly at Special School for Visually Handicapped. During the meetings we discuss on the various issues like development of the child in the academics. Training the parents for imparting Yoga to their children. Most of the parents are not aware of the importance of Braille Script. Hence they generally deny for the teaching of this Script and educating their children also. Through Counseling we are able to change the attitudes of the parents and today they are acting as guides to their children. Most of the children in the beginning are taught alphabets orally. Parents complaint their children are not writing anything. Such parents are invited to the school and the Braille Instructor demonstrate the Braille teaching process and the parents are counseled on the Braille Script writing.
- l) <u>Uploading of UDID Cards</u>: As per the instructions of Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment, Department of Empowerment of Persons With Disabilities, Government of India, vide Letter No. F.No.R-22033/3/2018-DD-II/V dated April 2020. The organization has uploaded 90 applications of our beneficiaries for the UDID Cards by 31-05-2020. We have uploaded applications of 100% of beneficiaries who are studying at our Special School for the Visually Handicapped.

#### 03. INCLUSIVE EDUCATION CENTRE, NIZAMABAD:

Sneha Society for Rural Reconstruction has initiated Inclusive Education Center in the year 2013 for 30 Scholastic Backwardness children, Mild Mental Retarded children, Multiple Disabled Children and Children having Speech Problems in Nizamabad Town. Inclusive Education is Providing Quality Education for all despite of Age, Disability, Gender ,etc. it is based on the right of all Learners to a quality education that accommodates their learning needs, it enhances educational opportunities for all children and not just students with special needs. We are providing Supportive Education along with Speech Therapy parental counseling and Reading Writing and Arithmetic is also developed. The children are showing good development in reading, Writing, Arithmetic, Cognitive development and they are also thought to reason out things. Their Behaviors are also modified and they can also adjust with the normal children.

The Inclusive education Center will provide the following services

- 1. Learning opportunities for all the children including Autism children
- 2. Creating accessible learning environment for all
- 3. Encouraging equal participation

- 4. Working along with special teachers, parents, specialists and other stake holder where necessary
- 5. Providing learning materials for students and teachers
- 6. Making individual Educational plans for special needs children involving parents, special teachers, specialists etc
- 7. Ongoing Monitoring of students
- 8. Providing teaching strategies and pedagogy that support quality education programs for inclusion of students with disabilities
- 9. Accepting the children with disabilities

#### 04. TARGETTED INTERVENTION (HIV/AIDS) PROJECT, NZBD

Sneha Society for Rural Reconstruction initiated its HIV/ AIDS prevention project AVAHAN in the year 2006 with the support from Alliance India. Sneha Targeted Intervention Project Implementing Targeted Intervention with core composite (FSW and MSM) is running with Telangana State AIDS Control Society (TSACS) and National AIDS Control Organization (NACO) support, aligned with National AIDS Control Programme IV guidelines. The goal of NACP-IV is to halt and reverse the epidemic. The key strategies include prevention, treatment, care and support.

Sneha TI Working with 4297 High Risk Groups such as Female sex workers 3086 Man Sex have with Man,s 1195 Transgenders 16 are benefited through clinical services on STI management and counseling, referral services on HIV, ART and TB, free condom supplies, community events and CBOs. The characteristics of clients group of sex workers is one and same in all hotspots and are comprised with agricultural and general labour, petty shop holders, auto drivers, business man of the local area, employees and students. The present scenario in FSW and MSM communities, they are aware of the intervention components and its impacts on their lives. Behaviour change among the community is visible. The project is addressing the issues of illiteracy, poverty, lack of savings, violence, exploitation, harassment that arises during the implementation. In the last 14 years, the project have undergone various phases of learning, significant expansion, scale-up of facilities and thrust on quality to ensure coverage saturation of relevant sub-populations with the appropriate programs and interventions.

#### Components of the Project

- 1. Management of STIs: Provided essential preventive care and accessibility through counseling services, quality treatment had provided on STI services and asymptomatic treatment to decrease infections, community has taken the project link services, through static clinic, Regular Monthly Checkup (RMC) of internal examination were conducted, there were 8 STI cases identified and treated with proper follow-up. Presumptive Treatment (PT) carried-out. Syphilis or RPR tests conducted. The community has been encouraged to undergo partner treatment to reduce the epidemic. Conducting motivational camps at micro level for the benefit of the secret based HRGs. Procured medicines from suggested vendors and from DAPCU and maintaining the stock registers as per the guidelines.
- 2. <u>Behaviour Change Communication</u>: Outreach staff has provided knowledge on health seeking behaviors at hotspot level though flip books, charts, IEC material, condom demo and re-demo to the 74.2% of the community in one-to-one sessions. Through this activity increased knowledge skills on risk perception and risk reduction and information on services, commodities availability for safe sex practices. Group meetings conducted at hotspot level to orient the benefits of CBO and its function and enrolled the members. Monthly hotspot meetings, DIC meetings and weekly reviews were conducted to follow-up the community and social-cultural activities.
- 3. <u>Referrals and Linkages</u>: The HRGs sent for referral services at TB screening, government ICTC and non-government services throughout the year. Referred HRGs for HIV test during the year, positives were registered in Pre-ART, CD4 and on-ART for further medication and enabling them to improve their quality of life. Positive Prevention rollout was completed. Project could identified 36 positive HRGs registered out of them 36 registered pre-ART and 36 on-ART.

These committees conducting monthly meetings regularly to build solidarity among the communities. Advocacy training programs have been organized to lead structural interventions to reduce their social and physical vulnerability in the society. CBOs are able to manage the program activities and took active part in DIC, Clinical services, managing rally on World AIDS day, Candle Light Memorial Day with members. Conducted Community based screening camps on the Hotspots.

#### 05. TARGETTED INTERVENTION HIV/AIDS PROJECT, MNCL:

Sneha Society for Rural Reconstruction has began its HIV/AIDS prevention project at Mancherial in the year 2017 with the support from NACO through TSACS. 2022 High Risk Groups have been benefited through clinical services on STI management and counseling, referral services on HIV, ART and TB, free condom supplies and community events .Sneha is working with 1254 Female Sex Workers , 736 Male Having Sex with Male and 32 Transgenders. Targeted Intervention with core composite (FSW and MSM) is running aligned with National AIDS Control Programme IV guidelines. The goal of NACP-IV is to halt and reverse the epidemic. The key strategies include prevention, treatment, care and support.

The characteristics of clients group of sex workers is one and same in all hotspots and are comprised with agricultural and general labour, petty shop holders, auto drivers, business man of the local area, employees and students. The present scenario in FSW and MSM communities, they are aware of the intervention components and its impacts on their lives. The utilization of clinical services and safe sex practices are increasing. Behavior change among the community is visible. The project is addressing the issues of illiteracy, poverty, lack of savings, violence, exploitation, harassment that arises during the implementation. In the last years, the project have undergone various phases of learning, significant expansion, scale-up of facilities and thrust on quality to ensure coverage saturation of relevant subpopulations with the appropriate programmers and interventions.

Almost all this region of the state experienced foreseen circumstance regarding the issue of separate statehood, which could affect the project implementations, but the organization took extra measures to overcome the situation. As a result, we could successfully achieve objectives under the components of the intervention during the reporting period.

Procured medicines from suggested vendors and from DAPCU and maintaining the stock registers as per the guidelines.
- 2. <u>Behaviour Change Communication</u>: Outreach staff has provided knowledge on health seeking behaviors at hotspot level though flip books, charts, IEC material, condom demo and re-demo to the 74.2% of the community in one-to-one sessions. Through this activity increased knowledge skills on risk perception and risk reduction and information on services, commodities availability for safe sex practices. Group meetings conducted at hotspot level to orient the benefits of CBO and its function and enrolled the members. Monthly hotspot meetings, DIC meetings and weekly reviews were conducted to follow-up the community and social-cultural activities.
- 3. <u>Referrals and Linkages</u>: The HRGs sent for referral services at TB screening, government ICTC and non-government services throughout the year. Referred HRGs for HIV test during the year, positives were registered in Pre-ART, CD4 and on-ART for further medication. ART Medicines provided to PLHAs at Godavarikhani, Government Area hospital, Positive Peoples Network society, Linkages to ART Mancherial Government Area hospital in enabling them to improve their quality of life. Positive Prevention rollout was completed. Project could identify Total 34 positive HRGs till date. During this year We could identify 3 HIV Positives, All 3 are linked to ART.

#### 6. WDF-NABARD WATERSHED PROJECTS:

Sneha Society for Rural Reconstruction has completed 3 WDF Watersheds named as Uthnoor Watershed and Juvvadi Watershed in Gandhari Mandal, Lingampalli Watershed in Sadashiva Nagar Mandal. These Watersheds are initiated in the year 2008. As a part of the project We have organized Exposure visits for the 3 Watersheds and organized Kalajatha Programs in 3 Watershed areas.

We have completed IV Stage of full Implementation Phase in Lingampalli Watershed, Juvvadi Watershed and Uthnoor Watershed. Near about 180 poor families are provided the loans under Livelihood activities and agricultural enhancement program. Total 3000 hectares are covered under our 3 Watersheds. Area treatment, drainage treatment, agricultural productivity enhancement programs are taken up in these watersheds area. We have also provided RO Water Purifier Plants to all the Watersheds.

Formation of Sub Committees for the implementation of the Watersheds: Every Watershed has 3 Committees for the implementation, supervision and monitoring of the Watersheds. The Watershed Development Committee Members are elected in the Grama Sabhas. All the elected Representatives elected village Watershed Development Committee, Livelihood Committee and Maintenance Committee. Each Committee has opened Bank Account with 2 signatories with NGO counter signature. The Committees will have the meeting every month at VWDC Office in the respective Watersheds. At present We focused more on Recovery of Livelihood Loans and Development of Maintenance Fund. NABARD Regional Office, Hyderabad is providing Grant-in-Aid to WDF-Watersheds for Juvvadi, Lingampalli and Uthnoor Watersheds of Kamareddy District, Telangana.

#### 7. **SAKHI ONE STOP CENTRE**:

SAKHI- One Stop Centre (OSC) is an Initiative of the Ministry of Women and Child Welfare, Government of India and at State level the Department of Women Development and Child Welfare Government of Telangana is responsible for overall support, supervision, direction and implementation of the scheme. The Tata Institute of Social Sciences, Hyderabad (TISS) is the technical partner in assisting the government. Implementing Partner is SNEHA SOCIETY FOR RURAL RECONSTRUCTION for the Nizamabad District of Telangana.

Our One Stop Centre(OSC) is intended to support women affected by violence, in private and public spaces, within the family, community and at the workplace. Women facing physical, sexual, emotional, psychological and economic abuse, irrespective of age, class, caste, education status, marital status, race and culture will be facilitated with support and redressal. Aggrieved women facing any kind of violence due to attempted sexual harassment, sexual assault, domestic violence, trafficking, acid attacks, dowry harassments who have reached out or been referred to the OSC will be provided with specialized, services. The Scheme of One Stop Centre was approved for implementation from 1st April, 2015 .But officially started in Nizamabad from 1st December-2017 with own constructed building within the premises of Govt. General Hospital, Nizamabad.

- 1. <u>24/7 Centre</u>: Any women /girl facing distress, harassment, and violence can approach the Sakhi center at any time. It runs 24/7 with a team comprising of Professional Psycho-social workers and lawyers to provide services like psycho-social counseling, legal counseling and legal aid.

- 2. <u>181 Helpline</u>: Sakhi is linked with women helpline 181 and provides long term counseling and other referral services to the women who approach Sakhi through 181.
- 3. <u>Rescue Vehicle</u>: To reach the woman or girl who are in need of a rescue any time of the day (24 hrs), a rescue vehicle is provided at Sakhi centre.

- We would like to restart the Special School for the Deaf and Mentally Retarded at Bhainsa where accommodation for the school is provided by Dr. M Mahipal, President, Sneha Society for Rural Reconstruction.
- We have received a proposal from Municipal Corporation Nizamabad for maintenance of shelter for attendants of patients who come to Government Hospital for the treatment.
